



MAKING MIGRATION WORK FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

REP. OF MOLDOVA

2011 - 2023

About 25 per cent of the Republic of Moldova's population lives abroad, including over one third of the labour force. As a result, the population in Moldova is ageing and rural areas are becoming depopulated. This poses significant developmental challenges that can be addressed by better leveraging the contributions of migrants and diaspora. Moldova's ethnic, linguistic and religious diversity and the arrival/transit of approximately a million of displaced Ukrainians mean that the country experiences a complex interplay of identity and human mobility.

Moldova has implemented the migration mainstreaming and development approach since its inception. The <u>M4SD Programme</u>

caused a "paradigm change" within the country. Before implementation, the term diaspora was hardly recognized and the connections between migration and development was not well known. Today, Moldova has integrated migration in more than 25 sectoral policies, is better equipped for EU accession, has strengthened its local network of development changemakers and has a strong relationship with its diaspora bolstered by the Diaspora Relations Bureau and a new engagement strategy. This approach also helped the government to be better equipped to deal with the ongoing Ukrainian displacement crisis with strong policy and institutional foundations.
