INTERNATIONAL MIGRANTS



Globally, 281 MILLION PEOPLE were estimated to be international migrants - people who were born in another country and/or held foreign citizenship - at mid-year 2020.

FEMALE MIGRANTS



An estimated 48 PER CENT of the total number of international migrants at mid-year 2020 were girls and women.

CHILD MIGRANTS



An estimated 13 PER CENT of the total number of international migrants in 2020 were children below 18 years of age.

YOUNG MIGRANTS



An estimated 11 PER CENT of the total number of international migrants at mid-year 2020 were between 15 and 24 years of age.

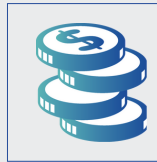
LABOUR MIGRANTS



An estimated 169 MILLION INTERNATIONAL MIGRANT WORKERS – defined as international migrants of working age in the labour force – made up 62 PER CENT of the total number of international migrants in 2019.

REMITTANCES



In 2023, remittances to low-and middle-income countries (LMICs) are estimated to have increased by 4 per cent compared to 2022 and reached USD 669 billion. Remittance flows exceeded Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) flows to LMICs by more than USD 250 billion in 2023.

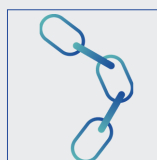
MISSING MIGRANTS



Between 2014 and 2023, at least 63,287 people lost their lives while migrating internationally. In 2024, another 1,749 migrant DEATHS AND DISAPPEARANCES were recorded globally as of 14 May 2024.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING VICTIMS



Over 206,000 VICTIMS AND SURVIVORS of trafficking have been identified by or reported to Counter Trafficking Data Collaborative (CTDC) partners between 2002 and 2022.

REFUGEES & ASYLUM-SEEKERS



By mid-year 2023, there were an estimated total of 36.4 MILLION REFUGEES and 6.1 MILLION ASYLUM-SEEKERS worldwide.

RESETTLED REFUGEES



According to government statistics, 59,500 REFUGEES were resettled in the first half of 2023. Though this number is 41 per cent higher than during the same period in 2022, it is only 3 per cent of the estimated resettlement needs.

INTERNALLY DISPLACED PERSONS



At the end of 2023, an estimated total of 75.9 MILLION people remained displaced within the borders of their own country - 68.3 million as a result of conflict and violence and 7.7 million as a result of disasters.

NEW INTERNAL DISPLACEMENTS



In 2023, there were an estimated 46.9 MILLION NEW INTERNAL DISPLACEMENTS - 26.4 million as a result of disasters and 20.5 million due to conflict and violence. New internal displacements due to conflict and violence in 2023 was 28 per cent lower than in 2022. However, the global figure in 2023 was 70 per cent higher than the past decade's annual average.
